



A super-easy Phone and Card Case

A raw edge project suitable for non-fraying fabrics

You will need:

- **Outer fabric** – A scrap of non-fraying fabric such as cork, leather, or vinyl
- **All Purpose thread** to match.

CALCULATE BODY PANEL SIZE



Cut a rectangle for the body in cork or other non-fraying fabric to fit your own mobile phone.
(Dimension guide below and illustrated in video tutorial.)

To calculate the height:

Measure the height of your phone from top to bottom and add 2cm (3/4").

Height _____ + 2cm (3/4") = _____ Panel height (H)



To calculate the width:

Wrap a tape measure fully around the width of your phone to find the total circumference – and add 2cm (3/4").

Circumference _____ + 2cm (3/4") = _____ Panel width (W)

CALCULATE POCKET PANEL SIZE

Cut a rectangle for the card pockets 10cm (4") high and with width calculated as follows:

Take your figure for the total panel width calculated above (W) and add 0.5cm (1/8").

This allows extra for the folded body panel underneath.

Height = _____ = 10cm (4")

Width = Panel width (W) + 0.5cm (1/8") = _____

Shape the top edge of the pocket panel into a shallow V if you wish.

This is a raw edge project where we use topstitching to attach each component. Topstitching should be 3mm (1/8") from the edge throughout unless otherwise stated.

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
